City of Minot CDBG Disaster Recovery Action Plan Amendment #10

THE CITY OF MINOT ACTION PLAN AMENDMENT (NO. 10)

The City is moving \$3,198,495 from activities that are finished or nearly finished and reprogramming those monies into the following activities:

- \$115,000 to a new affordable housing project
- \$2,833,495 for the voluntary and involuntary acquisition of additional properties in the flood inundation area
- \$250,000 for down payment assistance for homeowners
- Minor budget changes are being made to project delivery costs for the various activities.

By reprogramming these funds the City will be able to provide an additional 74 affordable rental housing units for its low-to - moderate-income (LMI) residents, provide homeownership assistance to 10 LMI buyers, and remove additional households out of harm's way.

Comment Period

Citizen participation is an essential component of the Citywide planning effort. The City of Minot strongly encourages public participation in identifying needs and the use of CDBG Disaster Recovery Funding. Citizens and other interested parties are invited to comment on Amendment 10.

A formal seven (7) day public comment period will begin on June 10, 2015 for Amendment 10 to the Action Plan. Comments will be accepted until close of business, June 17, 2015.
