The City of Minot, North Dakota was included in the CDBG-DR Program for 2011 Disasters. In June 2011, the City of Minot suffered substantial real estate and public infrastructure damage due to flood waters from the Mouse River (Souris River).

Due to the extensive displacement of residents as a result of the June 2011 flood, new development is needed outside of the flood area. The proposed Fire Station and Apparatus Project would serve to support future development in the southeast section of Minot, including the mixed-use 55th Crossing West Housing Project and a proposed middle school and high school, potentially to be sited north of the proposed fire station.

The proposed Fire Station and Apparatus Project would involve the acquisition of a currently vacant, approximately 42,850 square-foot lot located at the southeast corner of 55th Street SE and Sage Drive and the construction of a one-story 15,400 square-foot fire station. The station will provide 24-hour year-round service, and will therefore include living quarters: a kitchen, day room, restrooms, bedrooms and laundry facilities. The station will also include office space, a community/training room, exercise room, a decontamination room and four vehicle bays, which will be equipped with a Plymovent vehicle exhaust extraction system. The station will be built to meet ADA compliance standards. Water, sewer, gas (317 gross output MBH natural gas boilers) and electric utilities and phone and internet communication lines will be extended to the site. A 14 KW backup generator system will be installed. The facility would also include a ramp and parking area.

The proposed project would be in support of the mixed-use 55th Crossing West Housing Project currently in development, as well as a proposed middle school and high school, potentially to be sited north of the proposed fire station. The proposed project is associated with the CDBG-DR funded 55th Crossing West Housing Infrastructure Project and Northern Sanitary Sewer Project, which involve the improvement and extension of municipal utilities along and adjacent to 55th Street SE.

Dear Ms. Peters:

This department has reviewed the information concerning the above-referenced project submitted under date of January 22, 2014, with respect to possible environmental impacts.

This department believes that environmental impacts from the proposed construction will be minor and can be controlled by proper construction methods. With respect to construction, we have the following comments:

- 1. All necessary measures must be taken to minimize fugitive dust emissions created during construction activities. Any complaints that may arise are to be dealt with in an efficient and effective manner.
- 2. Care is to be taken during construction activity near any water of the state to minimize adverse effects on a water body. This includes minimal disturbance of stream beds and banks to prevent excess siltation, and the replacement and revegetation of any disturbed area as soon as possible after work has been completed. Caution must also be taken to prevent spills of oil and grease that may reach the receiving water from equipment maintenance, and/or the handling of fuels on the site. Guidelines for minimizing degradation to waterways during construction are attached.
- 3. Projects disturbing one or more acres are required to have a permit to discharge storm water runoff until the site is stabilized by the reestablishment of vegetation or other permanent cover. Projects disturbing less than one acre are required to have a permit if the site is part of a larger common plan of development or sale and the larger common plan will ultimately disturb one or more acres. A permit is not needed for projects that disturb less than one acre if they are located one-quarter of a mile or more apart and the area between the projects is not being disturbed. Further information on the storm water permit may be obtained from the Department's website or by calling the Division of Water Quality (701-328-5210). Also, cities may impose additional requirements and/or specific best management practices for construction affecting their storm drainage system. In addition, the City of Minot is required to consider and address post-construction storm water

quality as part of its NDPDES Small Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) General Permit obligations. Check with the local officials to be sure any local storm water management considerations are addressed.

4. Noise from construction activities may have adverse effects on persons who live near the construction area. Noise levels can be minimized by ensuring that construction equipment is equipped with a recommended muffler in good working order. Noise effects can also be minimized by ensuring that construction activities are not conducted during early morning or late evening hours.

The department owns no land in or adjacent to the proposed improvements, nor does it have any projects scheduled in the area. In addition, we believe the proposed activities are consistent with the State Implementation Plan for the Control of Air Pollution for the State of North Dakota.

These comments are based on the information provided about the project in the above-referenced submittal. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers may require a water quality certification from this department for the project if the project is subject to their Section 404 permitting process. Any additional information which may be required by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers under the process will be considered by this department in our determination regarding the issuance of such a certification.

Construction and Environmental Disturbance Requirements

These represent the minimum requirements of the North Dakota Department of Health. They ensure that minimal environmental degradation occurs as a result of construction or related work which has the potential to affect the waters of the State of North Dakota. All projects will be designed and implemented to restrict the losses or disturbances of soil, vegetative cover, and pollutants (chemical or biological) from a site.

Soils

Prevent the erosion of exposed soil surfaces and trapping sediments being transported. Examples include, but are not restricted to, sediment dams or berms, diversion dikes, hay bales as erosion checks, riprap, mesh or burlap blankets to hold soil during construction, and immediately establishing vegetative cover on disturbed areas after construction is completed. Fragile and sensitive areas such as wetlands, riparian zones, delicate flora, or land resources will be protected against compaction, vegetation loss, and unnecessary damage.

Surface Waters

All construction which directly or indirectly impacts aquatic systems will be managed to minimize impacts. All attempts will be made to prevent the contamination of water at construction sites from fuel spillage, lubricants, and chemicals, by following safe storage and handling procedures. Stream bank and stream bed disturbances will be controlled to minimize and/or prevent silt movement, nutrient upsurges, plant dislocation, and any physical, chemical, or biological disruption. The use of pesticides or herbicides in or near these systems is forbidden without approval from this Department.

Fill Material

Any fill material placed below the high water mark must be free of top soils, decomposable materials, and persistent synthetic organic compounds (in toxic concentrations). This includes, but is not limited to, asphalt, tires, treated lumber, and construction debris. The Department may require testing of fill materials. All temporary fills must be removed. Debris and solid wastes will be removed from the site and the impacted areas restored as nearly as possible to the original condition.

The City of Minot (City), North Dakota was included in the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) program for 2011 Disasters. In June 2011, the City of Minot suffered substantial damage due to flood waters from the Mouse River (Souris River). In accordance with the use of CDBG-DR funds, the City is the responsible entity for completing federally required environmental review in accordance with 24 CFR Part 58. The City retained CDM Smith to assist with the environmental review of the proposed Fire Station and Apparatus Project. Due to the extensive displacement of residents as a result of the June 2011 flood, new development is needed outside of the flood area. The proposed project would serve to support future development in the southeast section of Minot, including the mixed-use 55th Crossing West Housing Project and a proposed middle school and high school.

The proposed Fire Station and Apparatus Project would involve the acquisition of a currently vacant, approximately 42,850 square-foot, lot located at the southeast corner of 55th Street SE and Sage Drive and the construction of a one-story 15,400 square-foot fire station. The station will provide 24-hour year-round service, and will therefore include living quarters: a kitchen, day room, restrooms, bedrooms and laundry facilities. The station will also include office space, a community/training room, exercise room, a decontamination room and four vehicle bays, which will be equipped with a Plymovent vehicle exhaust extraction system. The station will be built to meet ADA compliance standards. Water, sewer, gas (natural gas boilers) and electric utilities and phone and internet communication lines will be extended to the site. A backup generator system will be installed. The facility would also include a ramp and parking area.

The proposed project would be in support of the mixed-use 55th Crossing West Housing Project currently in development, as well as a proposed middle school and high school, potentially to be sited north of the

Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures of 24 CFR Part 58 and shall be addressed to U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Region VIII Office, 8ADE, 1670 Broadway Street, Denver, Colorado 80202-4801.
