The City of Minot, North Dakota was included in the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) program for 2011 Disasters. In June 2011, the City of Minot suffered substantial real estate and public infrastructure damage due to flood waters from the Mouse River (Souris River). The flood debris caused the City's municipal solid waste (MSW) landfill to approach maximum capacity sooner than anticipated.

The MSW landfill has been in operation since 1993 and has undergone a series of expansions, constituting Cells 1 through 4. Cells 1 and 2 have reached their disposal capacity; Cells 3 and 4 are expected to reach capacity by 2013 and 2017, respectively. The proposed Cell 5 is designed to extend the life of the landfill an additional six years after construction, assuming no increases in tonnage received. The proposed Cell 5 comprises approximately 7.5 acres, located entirely within the City's landfill boundaries. This increase in capacity is necessary to provide continued solid waste disposal services to the City of Minot service area, which includes residential, commercial, and institutional facilities. It will be constructed in compliance with Federal and State requirements for MSW landfills.

Total project cost is \$5,871,471.49, with \$3,721,471.49 to be funded using CDBG-DR funds.


