THE CITY OF MINOT ACTION PLAN AMENDMENT (NO.5)

Upon a thorough review of beneficiary data for two CDBG-DR projects, the City is amending its Disaster Recovery Action Plan. Through this Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Disaster Recovery (DR) Amendment #5, the City is changing the Master and Control Lift station public facility activity from an Urgent Need related national objective to a public facility Low Moderate Income Area national objective. In addition the City is changing the Northern Sewer public facility activity from a Low to moderate income area national objective to an Urgent Need national objective. Attachment A provides a summary of the Action Plan changes, which are in red.

Justification for changing the Northern Sewer Project from Low Moderate Income Area to Urgent Need National Objective.

The City of Minot's CDBG-DR funding is appropriated in accordance with the 2012 Appropriations Act and the Federal Register [FR-5628-N-01]. The Federal register defines the type of eligible activities allowed for the CDBG-DR funds. Part F of the Act, entitled *Use of the urgent need national objective* defines Urgent Need as follows:

Urgent Need: Since the Department only provides CDBG disaster recovery awards to grantees with documented disaster-related impacts (as supported by data provided by FEMA, SBA, and other sources), and each grantee is limited to spending funds only in counties with a Presidential disaster declaration of recent origin respective to each appropriation, the following streamlined alternative requirement recognizes the inherent urgency in addressing the serious threat to community welfare following a major disaster.

Grantees need not issue formal certification statements in order to qualify an activity as meeting the urgent need national objective. Instead, each grantee receiving a direct award under this Notice must document how all programs and/or activities funded under the urgent need national objective respond to a disaster-related impact identified by the grantee.

The Northern Sewer Project is needed to route the North Hill sewage around the Valley Force Main that was damaged by the flood event in 2011. This reroute will reduce the flow through the damaged area and allow development in the North Hill area of the city to provide suitable housing choices for those displaced by the flood.

Justification for changing the Master and Control Lift Station activities from Urgent Need to Low Moderate Income Area National Objectives.

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Grantees should still be mindful to use the "low- and moderate income person benefit" national objective for all activities that qualify under such criteria.

A comprehensive review of all proposed infrastructure activities was undertaken to determine if any could meet the area benefit to LMI persons. Based on this review, it is apparent that the Master and Control lift station activities should be reclassified from Urgent Need to LMI. The direct benefit area for Master and Control lift stations are located completely within LMI census tract block groups.

Comment Period

Citizen participation is an essential component of the Citywide planning effort. The City of Minot strongly encourages public participation in identifying needs and the use of CDBG Disaster Recovery Funding. Citizens and other interested parties are invited to comment on Amendment 5.

A formal seven (7) day public comment period will began on June 28, 2013 for Amendment 5 to the Action Plan. Comments will be accepted until July 6, 2013.
